Cafeteria Finger Scanning

The cafeteria is moving to finger scanning in the lunch room as the method for checkout. Our other methods such as pin numbers and barcodes have become inefficient resulting in delays in the breakfast and lunch line. The finger scans will help resolve these issues and are 100% secure.

Thousands of school districts across the country have been using this technology for decades. The system will capture finger touch points and store the information as an alphanumeric code associated with your child's account. This process is not taking a fingerprint image and the data stored cannot be reproduced into a fingerprint.

We will start the finger scanning process of all students after fall break.

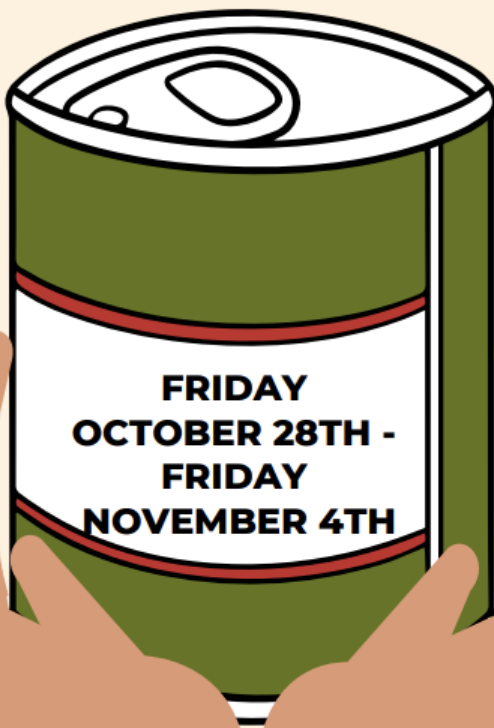
